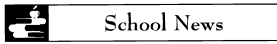

**Feast of Corpus Christi**

The Church celebrates the Eucharist in a special way today. Second only to Holy Thursday, the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ offers an opportunity to focus on the meaning of the Eucharistic Sacrament. Among other things, the Eucharist brings the Church together and sustains it. It makes real the basic mystery of the Christian faith; the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It provides spiritual food and empowers believers to follow Christ. To enter into the readings, simply reflect on what the Eucharist means to you. It's easy to be tempted, as the apostles were, to think that "we are in a deserted place." That is, to think we are in a situation where God's providence doesn't reach. We can come to think that our mundane and real problems and worries escape God's notice. And so it's also easy to take on the modern notion that we each have to fend for ourselves. Yet probably each of us will also carry an experience or memory of when God provided in unexpected ways. That experience or memory can serve as a key to unlock the real power of today's gospel reading for us.

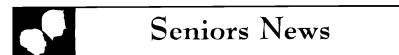


**Holy Name Breakfast & Sr. Margaret's Farewell**

**Pope Benedict's Encyclical Charity in Truth** "Openness to life is at the center of true development. When a society moves towards the denial or suppression of life, it ends up no longer finding the necessary motivation and energy to strive for man's true good. If personal and social sensitivity towards the acceptance of a new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away. The acceptance of life strengthens moral fiber and makes people capable of mutual help. By cultivating openness to life, wealthy peoples can better understand the needs of poor ones, they can avoid employing huge economic and intellectual resources to satisfy the selfish desires of their own citizens, and instead they can promote virtuous action within the perspective of production that is morally sound and marked by solidarity, respecting the fundamental right to life of every people and every individual" (From For Life, Volume 15, Issue 4 Fourth Quarter, 2009, Pro-Life Office, Diocese of Cleveland).
